

10 Best Techniques on Flower Arranging

Women don't just like diamonds but flowers as well. Are you the type who not only want to receive flowers but to arrange them yourself? If you are a florist at heart, this article will be very helpful for you. It offers some flower arranging tips that will assist you on how to create a professionally looking arrangement and on how to keep the flowers last longer.

9 Best Techniques on Flower Arranging

Technique No. 1: Water Works

You must put the floral arrangement in water as soon as possible. Fill container with lukewarm water, add floral preservative, and then add flowers.

Technique No. 2: Water Temperature Matters

Florist in Singapore recommends the use of warm water because it helps tightly closed flower heads like ranunculus and roses to open fully. Before using them, let them stay in water for a day or two.

Technique No. 3: Use Foam

For flowers to last longer, use florist's foam to keep them in place and constantly hydrated. Let the foam soak for 15 minutes before cutting it to fit the container. Water the foam every couple of days.

Technique No. 4: Cutting is a Must

Using a sharp knife, cut an inch off the stems, especially if the flowers will sit a while before being arranged. The stems absorb water better when it is freshly cut.

Technique No. 5: Trim, Trim, Trim

Just before adding the flowers to the arrangement, recut the stems. Strip off any leaves that fall below its waterline.

Technique No. 6: Choosing of Flowers

To ensure even placement on all sides, add heavy and large flowers first, turning the arrangement as you work. Then put the smaller, airier blooms, and leave some space in between the stems so individual flowers have room to shine. Include flowers with various stem lengths and shapes.

Technique No. 7: Flowers With the Same Colors

For a more interesting look, mix in different textures for a monochromatic arrangement.

Technique No. 8: Height Matters

Create a floral arrangement that is taller than its bucket by about one and a half times. In addition, make the width balance the height.

Technique No. 9: Fill-In

Save stems with leaves and larger leaves on them to fill in around the floral arrangement. Drape some of the greenery over the rim of the container.

Technique No. 10: Proper Flower Placement

Lastly, keep flowers away from heating vents and sunlight. Add water often and recut stems.

Floral arrangements are usually reserved for mantle displays and centerpieces because it adds natural beauty and dimension to any space.
